As a nurse in the emergency department at **Hotel Dieu Grace Hospital** in Windsor, ON **Melinda Suich** knows first hand what it's like to deal with emergency cases. On



September 15th, Melinda embarked on an experience that will not only strengthen her skill set, but will provide her with an opportunity to serve her country. Melinda travelled to Kandahar to serve for three months as a Critical Care Nursing Officer at Role 3 Hospital. She has reached the rank of Lieutenant in the Canadian Forces, where she has been a member to officially wher role as F presided over CEO of Catholic Heat International as well as Sister Sarah Maillet RHSJ Board Chair

since 2009. Melinda was required to complete all necessary training including boot camp, where she found herself alongside another RN and 17 Physicians from across Canada.

Upon arrival in Kandahar, Melinda will spend a few days with a fellow nurse who is finishing her term to become familiar with the hospital and area. The first half of her term will be spent in the Trauma Centre, where she will deal with anything from gun shot wounds and blast injuries to burns from IED's. As well, she will assist in the transport of critically ill Afghan patients, once stable, back to their own hospital, which unfortunately is outside of the base and approximately 20 minutes away. Melinda will be fully armoured and have an extensive security escort.

After spending time in trauma Melinda will then move to the ICU for the remainder of her time. With over 21 years of experience at Hotel Dieu Grace Hospital, 11 of which have been spent as an RN in the emergency department, Melinda describes this experience as both exciting and exhilarating.

Our prayers are with you Melinda as you embark on this healing mission.
