Langlade Hospital, Antigo WI celebrated the official Grand Opening of the new hospital on Friday, November 16th. Representatives from the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph (founding Religious Institute), Catholic Health International (Canonical Sponsor) and Aspirus, Inc. (one of the Corporate Members) welcomed 200 people to the celebration which included a ribbon cutting, speakers, Catholic Mass with Bishop Morneau, blessing of the LeRoyer Walkway and hors d'oeuvres. The new hospital opened its doors on May 13, replacing the original facility that dated back to the 1920s. Construction continues on a new Center for Health & Performance and a two-story addition to the General Clinic.

Committed to perpetuating the healing mission of Jesus

Hotel Dieu Grace Hospital, Windsor ON recently launched a new program entitled "No one Dies Alone".

Maria Giannotti, the Spiritual Care Coordinator at the hospital felt compelled to ensure that this never happened again, following an incident where a patient was alone in his final moments.

Maria did some research and found a volunteer program which began more than a decade ago at Sacred Heart

The program tries to ensure that patients are not alone in the final stages of their life, if there are no family or friends to be there.

A volunteer for this program is a very

special individual, who can sit for two to four hours at a time during vigils that can last from hours to days. The process of death can get emotional even for a volunteer; to watch someone as they die or draw their last breath is a very powerful experience. The task varies from simply sitting quietly with the patient, to holding their hand to reading to them, or holding the phone to their ear to hear the voices of their family members who are too far away to be there.

The hospital was able to raise some funds through their Gala dinner which was then matched by a very generous local donor. Eight volunteers have already come forward to participate in the program, which they plan to Pilot in one unit in January and roll out across the hospital in March.

Future editions of the Torch will report on the progress of this program.
