Nursing Week was celebrated from May 12 to 18th, to recognize the dedication of registered nurses, registered practical nurses and nurse practitioners. Twenty four hours a day, seven days a week, our nurses go the extra mile to provide for the needs of our patients. The impact of their contribution is felt in every aspect of care - it is a profession like no other.

At Hotel Dieu Shaver, nurses donated socks and underwear for clients of the local Community Care Centre, as well as proceeds from a sale of baked goods that they whipped up. Treats such as chocolate banana cake, rocky road cheesecake and heartshaped cookies were sold in the lobby. Christine Simpson, a registered nurse who was one of the organizers of a week's worth of activities said "it's all about supporting our community. Nurses are caring and nurturing by nature, and we like to lend a helping hand when we can," she said. "We appreciate all the support we get from the community and want to give back." Activities also included raising funds for the hospital auxiliary for additional equipment.

2014 also marked the first *Jeanne Mance Nursing Excellence Award* named for one of the founders of Montreal, who travelled from France with the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph in 1645 to found the first Hotel Dieu hospital in Canada.
