RELIGIOUS HOSPITALLERS
OF SAINT JOSEPH

The Congregation of the **Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph** was established in the town of La Flèche in the Loire Valley of France 378 years ago, on **May 18th**, 1643. Jérôme Le Royer de la Dauversière, a devout Catholic and tax collector for the town, had been receiving visions for six years in which God instructed him to found a congregation of Hospitaller Sisters, to build a hospital in La Flèche and to found a colony and a hospital in New France on the Island of Montreal.

He was involved in the administration of the old Maison Dieu (House of God) Hospital in La Flèche where the sick poor received care. There were three women who lived and worked there living on alms. Jérôme wondered what to do to improve their situation, so first he rebuilt the dilapidated hospital.

Marie de la Ferre visited the sick poor at Maison Dieu, and it was there that she met M. Le Royer. Marie also felt that God called on her to dedicate herself to the service of the sick poor. They received canonical approval from the Bishop of Angers in 1643, and the Daughters of St. Joseph, (as they were initially known) began.

The community was formed at the Maison Dieu (which became Hotel Dieu) with the three servants of the poor already on site. The first constitutions of the congregation were approved in 1644, when Marie de la Ferre and



eleven companions made their vows. Marie de la Ferre was their first superior. The Sisters dedicated themselves to the service of the poor, the sick, and the most needy.

A century and a half later, during the French Revolution the Sisters were expelled from La Flèche. The hospital was then converted into police station, court and prison. The staircase of the Hotel Dieu was walled in and forgotten. During demolition and restoration of the old prison in 1953 the oak staircase was rediscovered. The town of La Flèche offered it to Montreal as a symbol of the long alliance between the two cities.

Le Royer eventually accomplished all three elements of his mission. Colonizing the island of Montreal occupied him for the decade following his first vision.

Hotel Dieu Hospital, Kingston ON celebrated St. Joseph the Worker Day on May 1, 2014.




St. Joseph is the patron saint of the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph, the congregation of Sisters who founded many of our facilities.
