Mr. Savoie has held various leadership positions within the Knights of Columbus, most recently the second highest in command worldwide with the





St. Joseph's Community Health Centre, Dalhousie, NB Vitalité Health Network has announced that three new Ambulatory Care clinics will be opened at our hospital in Dalhousie. Specifically, a Foot Care Clinic, Anticoagulant Therapy Clinic and Urological Wellness Clinic. These Clinics should be operation this fall. This expanded access to primary healthcare in a Clinic setting will reduce the need for hospitalization when the appropriate ambulatory care could have prevented or reduced the need for hospital admission. These three new Clinics join the approximately 15 others being offered on an ambulatory care basis at <u>St. Joseph's Community Health Centre</u>.

HDGH recently appointed a full time ethicist, contracted through the Centre for Clinical Ethics in Toronto. Rosalind (Roz) Abdool, Clinical Ethicist joined HDGH in June. Roz completed her clinical ethics training through the Centre for Clinical Ethics at St. Joseph's Health Centre, St. Michael's Hospital and Providence Healthcare in Toronto and jointly through the

University of Toronto's Joint Centre for Bioethics. A number of Catholic Sponsor groups (including CHI) provided funding to the Centre to ensure ongoing ethicist education and availability of ethicists into the future.

Roz served on the Ethics Committee at the Waterloo-Wellington CCAC and is currently onthe board of the Canadian Bioethics Society.

"Clinical Ethics provides an open dialogue to reflect on what one "could" and "should" do when facing challenging health care circumstances," states Roz. "Ethical issues might include, deciding between competing values, moral distress and burnout, patients choosing to live at risk, the withdrawal/ withholding of life sustaining treatment, capacity, substitute decision-making and complex discharge issues."
