On Saturday, February 8th, over 400 Grace Hospital Graduates, former employees, and community members with connections to the beloved Salvation Army Grace Hospital gathered to celebrate its 100-year legacy. On February 1, 1920 Windsor's second hospital, and the Salvation Army's first general hospital, was opened to carry on the Army's mission of mercy. Grace quickly became the place for patient-centred care and had a lasting impact on all those who walked through its doors. Before its doors were officially closed in 2004, over 1,500 nurses were graduated from the hospital's School of Nursing, tens of thousands of babies were welcomed into the world, and the entire Windsor-Essex community benefited from the care of Grace Hospital. Today, over 100 years and numerous changes later, Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare stands today, proud to carry the Grace name now and into the future.

Hotel Dieu Hospital Annual Coat Drive

Coat drive brings warmth to more than 1000 people in Kingston

Thanks to many generous donations, living the Mission of being a caring and just community at Hotel Dieu Hospital in Kingston translated into a warmer winter for hundreds in Kingston this year.

When the annual Hotel Dieu Hospital/St. Mary's Cathedral Winter Coat Drive wrapped up on January 17th, the distribution center at St. Mary's Parish Hall had handed out almost 3000 warm winter coats and

accessories. In total, 1062 people (compared to 964 last year) visited the distribution location.

"While it's never encouraging to see such a high level of need, it's very heartening to see the generosity that allowed such a fulsome response," says Elizabeth Bardon, VP Mission & Strategy Integration and Support Services at the Hotel Dieu Hospital site of Kingston Health Sciences Centre. "This was our busiest season ever and, fortunately, we had more inventory than ever before!" "The annual Coat Drive is a project close to our hearts at Hotel Dieu Hospital,"

she says. "We're so grateful that staff, volunteers and community members rally every year to support those in need, especially those who might be out on our streets in bone-chilling weather this winter."

Members of the Aspirus Langlade Hospital Mission Integration Committee volunteer as part of the Weekend Backpack Program. In 2015 a Community Needs Assessment found that food insecurity was a problem in Langlade County, especially for children. The committee decided that providing backpacks that contain enough nutritious and easy-to-prepare food to supplement each child's diet through the weekend was the way forward. From October to May, about 300 backpacks are prepared weekly on Wednesday evenings and sent home with children from every school in the Antigo area on Fridays. Although Aspirus Langlade Hospital continues to champion the program, it has now become a communitywide volunteer effort. Thank you for all you do for the community!
