St. Joseph's Continuing Care Centre launches hospital-to-home telehealth

ST. loseph's In a first for Ontario, St. Joseph's Continuing Care Centre in Cornwall has been approved for an innovative, new pilot program that will leverage virtual care technology and tools to support vulnerable seniors after they are discharged home for up to 30 days—at no cost to the patient. The goal of the initiative, supported by Ontario Health (OTN), is to improve patient outcomes and to provide a safe transition from hospital to home, along with a positive handoff to other community care providers.

SJCCC will soon begin to offer individuals returning home an easy-to-use app they can download on a mobile device or tablet. Through it, they will get timely reminders about their discharge-plan instructions. They can also access self-care learning video resources and use secure messaging and video calls to connect directly with a dedicated care team at SJCCC. Patients can also use Bluetooth-enabled health devices for the care team to monitor their blood pressure, weight and pulse. For patients without their own devices or Internet access, SJCCC will provide the technology required, along with user-friendly, one-on-one training.

The new pilot will complement efforts already underway at SJCCC in recent years to provide "restorative care" to patients, mostly seniors, in its 58-bed Hotel Dieu Hospital. The focus is on "slow-paced rehabilitation" for those who need additional strengthening after surgery and/or periods of deconditioning before they return home. The program, which helps several hundred patients annually, has seen successful outcomes, and is designed to help patients stay in their homes longer, alleviating or delaying the need for institutionalized long-term care.
