

CHARLES HOLLAND - BOARD MEMBER

He holds graduate degrees in Health Law and Social Services Administration from Loyola University, Chicago and from University of Chicago. In 2011 he completed the Ministerial Leadership Preparation Program of the Francis Cardinal George Center for Ministerial Development, a program designed to prepare lay leaders to assume leadership of Catholic healthcare organizations.

Domestic/Intimate Partner Violence Sector Funding



On March 1st N.B. Womens Shelter and the Réseau des services pour victimes de violence du Nouveau-Brunswick, which includes Nadia Losier from L'Accueil Sainte-Famille, held discussions with the Department of Social Development and the Women's Equality Branch of the Government of New Brunswick. The Hon. Bruce Fitch, Minister of Social Development, and the Hon. Tammy Scott Wallace attended. The discussion centered on the funding crisis in the domestic/intimate partner violence (DIPV) sector. It is expected that the groups will meet again to "dive further into the chronic underfunding situation" in the DIPV sector.
