2021 RECORD BREAKING YEAR FOR PIMFB

In a recent edition of the Partners in Mission Food Bank newsletter, three volunteers were highlighted as part of "The Heroes of Hunger," volunteers from the Food Bank. Keri Laframboise, Doug Cherry and Bruce Wilson were the featured volunteers this month. They are part of a large team of volunteers who donated over 11,000 hours in 2021. The team distributed 14,229 food hampers and helped 6022 people in the Kingston area - 27% of whom were children. That is approximately 2.8 million dollars worth of food. 2021 was a record year for Partners in Mission Food Bank.
