# Hotel-Dieu of St. Joseph Hospital celebrates 75 years



Hôtel-Dieu of St. Joseph Perth-Andover





Hotel-Dieu of St. Joseph Hospital (HDSJ) in Perth-Andover, New Brunswick had humble beginnings, starting out in a house once known as Anne's Tea Room, with 11 patient beds. From those humble beginnings, it has grown, and September 2022 marked the 75th anniversary in Perth-Andover – an incredible milestone.

Three Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph (RHSJ) sisters, Sisters Leona Haché, Yvonne Hubert and Corrine Kerr went on to establish the hospital and the very first patient was admitted on Oct 28, 1947. Over the years there have been numerous changes to HDSJ, including expansions, renovations, and modernizations, but the history of the facility is never forgotten and runs deep through the halls. HDSJ remains under the sponsorship by

Catholic Health International and is operated by Horizon Health Network. The RHSJ sisters worked tirelessly to establish and promote health care in Perth-Andover and surrounding communities. RHSJ Sisters Thérèse Mulherin & Bertille Beaulieu along with Dr. Robert Stewart, President and CEO of CHI, were present at the celebration. Facility Manager Sherry Leech, former Facility Managers Joy Van Tassel (president of the HDSJ Foundation) and Karen O'Regan (HDSJ Advisory Chairperson) along with Fr. Gilbert Dodatto were in also in attendance. Congratulations to Hotel Dieu St. Joseph of Perth-Andover on their many years of service to their community.


