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## SR. JULIANA CASEY, PIONEER IN THE FIELDS OF MISSION & LEADERSHIP FORMATION

Sr. Juliana Casey, IHM, died December 29, 2022 at the motherhouse of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate

Heart of Mary, in Michigan. She was 82. An acclaimed theologian, Sr. Casey was a thought leader in Catholic health care for nearly three decades. She was the Catholic Health Association of the United States' vice president of mission services, where she pioneered a program to prepare people to be mission leaders in health care facilities. In 1991, she wrote Food for the Journey: Theological Foundations of Catholic Healthcare which is considered an essential formation resource to this day. Sr. Juliana was the key note speaker at the Catholic Health Association of New Brunswick Annual Conference in Edmundston in 2001.
