On May 29th, l'Hôpital de l'Enfant-Jésus Foundation, in partnership with Vitalité Health Network, celebrated the reopening of the renovated oncology clinic at l'Hôpital de l'Enfant-Jésus RHSJ in Caraquet, N.B. The almost \$2 million renovations and upgrading of the clinic was funded by the Vitalité and the Foundation and included the acquisition of an ABUS automated breast ultrasound system. "Thanks to the generosity of our donors, cancer patients can continue to receive high-quality treatment in our region, enabling them to avoid having to travel outside the region and recover in the comfort of their own homes" said Christina Mallet, President of the Fondation Hôpital de l'Enfant-Jésus.

The clinic is named the "RELIGIEUSES HOSPITALIÈRES SAINT-JOSEPH oncology clinic" and recognizes not only a significant contribution to the funding of the project by the RHSJs but their commitment to healthcare, particularly in the Acadian peninsula. Congratulations to the Religieuses Hospitalières Saint-Joseph, l'Hôpital de l'Enfant-Jésus and their Foundation on the completion of this project and on the improvements in oncology care in the community.
