SISTER SARAH MAILLET

The Catholic Health International Family was saddened on Saturday, November 25th upon hearing of the death of Sister Sarah Maillet, rhsj the first Chairperson of Catholic Health International's Board of Directors and one of the Founders. Sister Sarah was instrumental in the establishment of Catholic Health Partners Inc. operating now as Catholic Health International. Her vision and her positive attitude made all of those working with her a joy and gave them great satisfaction.

Sister Sarah (as she was affectionately known) was born in Ste-Marie-de Kent, New Brunswick and entered the Religious Hospitallers of Saint-Joseph at Bathurst on November 21, 1945. She took her final religious vows on September 8, 1947. She worked as a teacher then a nurse receiving her nursing degree from the University of Moncton and was superior of many of her religious communities.



Devoting herself for many years to Catholic Health care in Canada she served as Chair of the Catholic Health Association of New Brunswick, worked for the Catholic Health Association of Canada in Ottawa, and was Chair of Catholic Health International. She also served on the Board of Directors of a number of facilities, including Foyer Notre Dame de Lourdes Inc in Bathurst; Mount Saint Joseph Nursing Home in Miramichi; and the region six Heath Corporation in Bathurst.



She was a very gifted lady and created many friends throughout the Catholic health world and the communities in which she served. Her funeral was held on Wednesday, November 29th in Bathurst. May the Lord hold her in the palm of His hand and may she rest in peace forever as a faithful servant.


ST: BERNARD HOSPITAL AND HEALTH CARE CENTER SBH RECEIVES ANOTHER "A" GRADE

As far as music, my favourite is Italian opera especially Giuseppe Verdi's *Va Pensiero* from the opera *Nabucco* and Puccini's *Nessun Dorma* from *Turandot*. I find it amusing that in the 18th century Pope Clement XI was alarmed that Italian opera was 'dangerously arousing'.

How do you relax?

Besides listening to music, there is nothing like working in the rose garden... with real manure.

What was your happiest moment?

The happiest moments of my life was our wedding day and holding my children for the first time.

What is the toughest job you've done?

The toughest job in my life was consolidating two acute care hospitals, Hotel Dieu and Grace hospitals in Windsor, ON and eventually closing the Grace Hospital. This was a most challenging change process that required constant communication and participation at many levels. Just imagine consolidating two medical staffs into one and combining all departments and services.

How did you become involved in Catholic healthcare?

As an orderly working at Hotel Dieu in Windsor, ON earning my way to university, I met a number of sisters including Sr. Dufault and Sr. LeBoeuf. The example of the sisters and their assistance helped me choose my career in health care and eventually Catholic healthcare.

What do you enjoy most about being on the CHI Board of Directors?

I enjoy working with the people on the Board and in our facilities, learning and supporting them in the many challenges being faced.

What is something that people would be surprised to know about you?

People might be surprised to know that I also love listening and dancing to 1960's rock and roll, especially the Beatles.

MASTER LISTS OF CATHOLIC HOSPITALS IN CANADA

Greg J Humbert has completed a 19 year project to compile The Master Lists of Catholic Hospitals in Canada since 1639. Greg states that the purpose of this list is two fold. "Firstly, to emphasize that the 54 congregations of Women Religious (and the four congregations of Men Religious) were not only pioneers of health care delivery and nursing education in Canada, but furthermore, their scope of service was national" and

"secondly, they provided a style of compassionate and values-based health care that made its mark on health care delivery in Canada... In short, these congregations of Women Religious and Men, who owned and operated hospitals in Canada, made a significant and lasting contribution to the health care that we all rely on, and are thankful for, today." 
